Ceramics: Intermediate level II Syllabus Fall 2021

There are a variety of projects this semester. Those in **bold letters are graded**. They include but are not limited to:

- 1. Policy sheet read, sign & parents sign and return. Intro 8/20, Due 8/23.
- 2. Catch-all-tray design, create with slabs, score and textured. Intro 8/19, Due 8/25-26.
- 3. Sketchbook cover or divider page intro 8/27, Complete by 8/31. Create a page with your name, at least 10 images of a particular form, and an art-related quote (with author's name) that speaks to you.
- 4. Prelim Sketchbook grade Intro starting 8/27. Due 9/7. First few pages in sketchbook including: Cover*, Goals*, Vocab*, pre-assessment, and handouts (policy, syllabus, grading criteria). *Fun and creative pages earn more points.
- 5. Basic Vocabulary, understanding working qualities of clay, practice wedging clay, pre-assessment, **Elements of Art, Principals of Design,** studio jobs, google drive, handouts, grading policies. Intro 8/18-9/10. Various due dates.
- 6. Clayworks and practice time, Surface Décor, Mugs, Handles, Bowls for MRC, Clay Pumpkin carving various skills learned and applied to individually designed pieces. Intro starting Sept 1. Various due dates.
- 7. Clay Head Studies monthly instruction of sculpting a realistic human head. *1st* stage in Sept. 2^{nd} in Oct. 3^{rd} in Nov. 4^{th} in Dec.
- 8. **Ceramic History** / **Clay Artists** *you should know* historical and contemporary awareness. Intro every other Block day as time allows. The majority of these will be introduced within google classroom.
- 9. Completion of **Studio Skills** throughout the semester. Instruction necessary. You may work with a partner to: a. Help load/unload a bisque and/or glaze kiln
 - b. Prep glaze stir and sieve a glaze batch
 - c. Help set out recycle slip to dry out on a Fridayduring a weekend.

10. **In-Depth projects** 4+ weeks per session, split grouping Session One = 9/8 – 10/6 Session Two = 10/18 – 11/12

- a. The Functional Vase pottery wheel
 - i. 1st week Skill Challenge contest for greatest height and volume. Simon Leach, Bill VanGilder, Adam Field demo
 - ii. 2nd week claywork up to 5 lbs. Research and Development, inspiration, develop visual library in sketchbook: vases, pitchers, mugs, jars.
 - iii. 3rd week Continue with variety of forms. Demonstration on pulled handles block period.
 - iv. 4th week Continue, trim if necessary. Complete and submit at least 5 completed forms demonstrating ability beyond bowls and cups. Height > Width!

b. Sculptural – Full Size Head Study

- i. 1st week Begin building with wire armature, Styrofoam, and oil-based clay. Awareness of proportion/scale
- ii. 2nd week *research and development*, inspiration, develop visual library in sketchbook,
 - consider realism --- abstraction, clay artworks, refining ideas. Define your own direction.
- iii. 3rd week Begin construction with paper mold and stoneware clay.
- iv. 4th week Continue claywork, allow for slow & controlled drying, check regularly to prevent/fix cracking.
- 11. Fall Break Oct 7-10 Enjoy!
- 12. Head Studies, Artist Studies, Dry Brush Painting, and Glazing for gas kiln fired stoneware. Oct 11-15
- 13. Quiz on vocab, various processes, material handling, etc. Sometime within Oct 11-15.
- 14. 2nd session of **In-Depth** projects Oct 18 Nov 12.
- 15. Last day for greenware (wet clay) Friday Dec 3rd.
- 16. Last Bisque Fire loading Fri Dec 10, unloaded by Tue Dec 14th.
- 17. Addendum to Glazing and Decoration Dec 13-17.
- 18. Last Glaze Firing Dec 15/16.
- 19. Your **Final** will consist of the following:
 - a. Final Test given during Finals week.
 - b. Completed Head Study with stages 1,2,3,4,+
 - c. Cleaning of the studio on last block period Dec 20-21).
